The Program

Become a highly effective educator with a year of training, guidance, and coaching from an experienced mentor teacher. Learn and teach in a supportive, dynamic environment, inspiring your students every day.

During the Training Year

- Obtain practical classroom experience with structured, results-driven coaching from a mentor teacher
- Partner with other residents in a cohort, creating a built-in support system
- Earn a master's degree to advance your skills and knowledge; tuition rates are subsidized and financial aid is available
- Receive a \$20,000 training scholarship (paid to resident)
- Obtain eligibility for an Illinois Educator License

After the Training Year

- Commit to teach in an AUSL-managed Chicago Public School for at least four years
- Receive ongoing professional development and support from expert coaches
- Join a network of committed educators making a difference in the lives of nearly 18,000 students
- Enter the teaching field with a master's degree and earn a CPS salary at a master's degree level (starting salary at \$54,161)
- Receive Federal Teacher Loan Forgiveness after five years

Minimum Requirements to Apply

- Bachelor's degree by June 2017
- Preferred GPA of 3.0/4.0 in the last 60 hours of university coursework
- U.S. citizen, national, or permanent resident
- Course credits that meet the Illinois content requirements for the grade level/content area you would like to become licensed to teach

- Middle (6-8): Language Arts, Math, and Science
- Special Education (K-12)

Required Documents

- Resume
- Transcripts from each university attended (unofficial acceptable until interview)
- Transcript Analysis Form
- Personal statement
- Video essay

Testing Requirements

All candidates are required to take and pass the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), as well as a content area test, before the start of the program. Candidates are not required to register or test prior to submitting their application but are encouraged to begin preparing.

The Illinois State Board of Education allows candidates to use their qualifying existing ACT/SAT score in lieu of passing the TAP.
